Gosnells Oval work starts

Gosnells Oval will be closed to community members while the first stage of the Master Plan is underway, including grandstand restoration works, drainage improvements and an upgrade to the playing surface.

The heritage-listed RS Sampson Grandstand, which was originally built in 1959, requires work to keep it structurally sound. New drainage and irrigation systems will also be installed to address ongoing drainage issues.

The works are expected to be completed in the first half of 2023.

Over the next five years, the City will progressively improve the site, including providing a new all-abilities playground, for the community to enjoy long into the future.

William Street

Drivers, passengers and pedestrians will now be safer travelling along William Street, following the completion of a new roundabout at the intersection of Camberwell Street.

The new intersection included the realignment of Bickley Road to create a four-way roundabout, replacing the previous T-intersections and improving access to businesses along the strip.

The \$1.65million project was funded by the Australian Government Blackspot Program.
