The Sutherlands Park Master Plan and the concept plan for a Youth Entertainment Space (YES) have been adopted, with work to progress this major investment in sport and recreation already underway. These plans will ensure the 67-hectare Sutherlands Park will become a one-stop sporting hub for the whole community, including a new Sutherlands Park Leisure and Aquatic Sports Hub, or SPLASH. Improving our natural environment will also be a priority in 2023, with further funding secured to progress the rehabilitation of bushland and waterways where the Southern and Canning Rivers meet, which will have significant flow-on effects downstream. We also have a full calendar of programs and events planned this year, and I look forward to celebrating our diverse and vibrant community together with you.

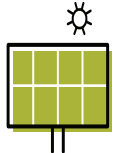
