



# Life in the City of Gosnells

### Apply now for Community Grants



It's the first round of funding available since the City increased funding as part of its expanded Grants Program. The increase in the funding amount will help to cushion the blow of rising costs and ensure groups can still achieve their goals.

The Level 2 grants provide up to \$10,000 to support equipment upgrades, minor capital works, community events and programs, and training and professional development of employees and volunteers.

Incorporated not-for-profit organisations, community groups and sporting clubs are all eligible to apply and applications close 30 September.

Level 1 grants, which provide up to \$2,500 to support small-scale local initiatives are open year round with applications considered on the 24th of each month.

Up to \$200 is available for residents to host a neighbourhood event – whether in your front yard or at the local park. Street Meet and Greet events are a great way to improve community safety and help everyone feel better connected.

To help break the ice and keep everyone entertained, sporting equipment is available for hire from Gosnells District Neighbourhood Watch.

Hosts may also be eligible for an additional \$50 voucher provided by Gosnells District Neighbourhood Watch.

The program was popular when it launched last year, so be quick to avoid missing out.



#### Plant a waterwise verge

The wet weather needn't dampen your spirits – now is one of the best times of the year to plant your Waterwise verge garden.

As a Gold Waterwise Council, the City of Gosnells is actively encouraging residents to save water and establish a healthy Waterwise verge garden, while complying with the City's verge rules. #### Councillor's Corner

The Local Government Election is just around the corner, on Saturday 21 October, and your ballot papers will be posted to you in the coming weeks.

This year, the way you elect your Mayor and Councillors has changed. The Mayor will be popularly elected for the first time and optional preferential voting has also been introduced.

You will receive two ballot papers in the mail this year, one for the Mayor and one for Councillors, along with information on how to vote, candidate profiles and a

return envelope, so keep your eyes on your letterbox and have your say.

Optional preferential voting is similar to how you vote in State and Federal elections, however you do not need to number all the candidates on the ballot paper.

The Local Government Election is a good time to learn more about the Council, how it runs and the decisions it makes.
