Get ready for Fusion Festival

Celebrate diversity at the City of Gosnells Fusion Food and Culture Festival over two huge nights from 5pm to 9pm on Friday 10 and Saturday 11 November, at Mills Park, Beckenham.

The City's biggest annual community celebration will include a huge variety of multicultural performances across two stages, culminating each night in a spectacular fireworks finale. Moving among the crowds at this year's festival will be The Guardian, a 10-metre-long glowing puppet, reminiscent of a crystal lion, which will be brought to life with smoke, wind and lighting effects by eight puppeteers.

Global Village will be expanded this year to include the Viva Stage, showcasing a range of traditional dance, costumes, arts and crafts, plus displays and presentations by local multicultural groups. Sideshow Alley will also return with carnival rides and attractions subsidised by the City of Gosnells.

Free youth and children's activities will be back, along with roving entertainment and displays and activities. And for those who require a break from the hustle and bustle, a Sensory Safe Space and Multi-Faith Worship Space are available at Mills Park Library.
