## Councillor's Corner

The Armadale Gosnells Landcare Group is a community-led group partly funded by the City. Founded in 1996, it focuses on coordinating landcare planning, river restoration and bushland management. It has only three paid staff members, but by harnessing the energy of community groups, local residents, landowners and volunteers, it quietly goes about its tasks. Every time I attend one of their meetings, I am amazed by the quantity and the quality of the work they do.

It was recently announced they will receive part of \$10 million in Federal funding for rehabilitating the Canning, Southern and Wungong Rivers. Their work will involve weed control and the planting of tens of thousands of local native plants along the foreshores of these rivers. My dream is to see the land abutting the Canning and Southern Rivers become the jewel in the crown of our parkland – a go-to destination for passive recreation.
