



Life in the City of Gosnells

Help City's smart drainage win award

A program using smart technologies to improve the way drainage is managed in the City of Gosnells is in line for a prestigious National Local Government Award – and the City needs your help.

With two major rivers and large wetland areas in the City, drainage is critical but often-overlooked infrastructure. The program has improved the City's ability to monitor, maintain and repair the drainage network, reducing the effects of drainage work on nearby residents, providing early warning of local flooding and saving the City money.

The technologies implemented as part of the program include tractor-mounted CCTV to investigate inside pipes, push cameras to go where the tractor cannot reach, Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR) connected to interpretive software to identify and accurately size air pockets in the soil surrounding damaged pipes, (which can then be filled with expanding foam technology) and flow meters linked to texting software so the City's drainage crews are called to the site before flooding occurs.

The program recently won two awards at the Institute of Public Works Engineering Australia (IPWEA) WA Excellence Awards, and now it's in line for a National Local Government Award.

Hazardous waste drop off

Drop off your household hazardous waste to the City of Gosnells Operations Centre on **Saturday 20 April**, from 8am – 3pm.

The City will be collecting items including aerosols, gas bottles, car batteries, paint, solvents, household chemicals, fluorescent globes and tubes, x-rays, tyres, e-waste, pool chemicals, flares, smoke detectors, used engine oil, bulk cardboard and polystyrene.

Charities will also be on site collecting clothing and accessories.

Simply load up your vehicle, bring along proof of residency and drive through the drop-off area at 2 Canning Park Avenue, Maddington.

Limits apply, so please check the City's website for details. Commercial waste will not be accepted.
