Planning services now online

New online services mean that all building and planning approvals, as well as subdivision clearance, can now be lodged and tracked via the City's website.

Access is easy – simply register as a home or business user and start your application.

Mayor Glenn Dewhurst said the City's expanding range of online services provided the community with greater convenience.

"People can still submit paperwork in person or via mail, however we understand that more people want the ability to apply for Council approval in their own time, when it's convenient to them," Mayor Dewhurst added.

Online building and planning applications include:

- Building, occupancy or demolition permits
- Home business or Family Day Care approval
- Signage approval
- Subdivision clearance
- Commercial vehicle parking in residential zone
- Sheds and patios (minor structures) approval
- Industrial and commercial development approval

Update on City projects

Emerald Park, Canning Vale

Construction of this \$700,000 nature-based redevelopment is on-track for completion in the coming months.

Residents will soon be able to enjoy a new children's nature play area, path network with lighting, barbecue and shaded seating, as well as open grassed areas, seating areas in the environmental zone, mature tree plantings and landscaped gardens. The project is part of the City's Public Open Space Strategy to improve parks and reserves across the region and will be a welcome addition to the community.

Work underway for Campbell Road left turn

Improvements are currently being made to improve traffic movement at the intersection of Campbell and Ranford Roads in Canning Vale.

A new left-turn lane from Campbell Road into Ranford Road is currently under construction, with the project expected to be completed this month.

Hazardous Waste Collection Day

Residents can safely dispose of hazardous household items at a free drop-off day on **Saturday 8 June**. Items that should not go into your waste or recycling bins, such as batteries, flammable liquids, gas bottles, paint, poisons and pool chemicals, can be dropped off between 9am and 1pm at the City's Operations Centre, 1 Canning Park Avenue, Maddington.



Upgrade at Jean Garvey Park, Gosnells

The Shack youth centre, Gosnells, was given a makeover in 2018 and this year, the City has focused on improving the outside with a \$100,000 upgrade. A new path network now connects The Shack and skate park, the rest of the reserve and public transport. LED lighting will soon be installed and line markings will provide a new space for young people to play ball games.



Burslem Drive widening, Maddington

Planning is progressing for the widening of Burslem Drive, between Olga Road and Atfield Street in Maddington. The City anticipates the project to be completed by mid-2021.
