

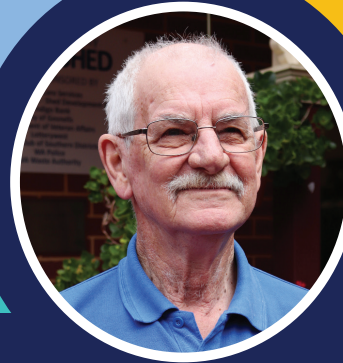


1. What is your involvement in the community?
