

Economic Profile of the City of Gosnells



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Introduction

This Economic Profile describes the people, businesses and economy of the City of Gosnells. In particular, it contains data on demographics, business types and locations and the characteristics of the local workforce.

Data sources


Much of the information in this publication is drawn from, or is based on, the Census of Population and Housing conducted by the Australian Bureau of Statistics. The most recent Census took place in August 2011, but because of the time required to check and collate the large amount of information gathered in the Census, it was not until March 2013 that all data from the last census was released. This publication is therefore the most comprehensive and up-to-date information source available for the City of Gosnells.

Other data sources referenced in this Economic Profile include the Australian Business Register (for business demographics), workforce data provided by the Western Australian Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations and economic and demographic data customised for the City of Gosnells by id Consulting Pty Ltd and REMPLAN.

About the City of Gosnells

The City of Gosnells is 17 km south-east of the central business district of the VVA State capital Perth (see map below). It has a population of approximately 115,675 and includes the suburbs of Beckenham, Canning Vale (part), Gosnells, Huntingdale, Kenwick, Langford, Maddington, Martin, Orange Grove, Southern River and Thornlie.

The City has substantial areas of State forest and covers an area of about 128 square kilometres, which makes it one of the largest local governments in WA.




The City of Gosnells – a brief profile

The City is a rapidly growing residential area, but it also has substantial rural areas in the east and south and some important commercial and industrial areas, particularly along the Albany Highway. Most of the population lives in suburbs west of Albany Highway, a major arterial road running south-east from Perth's CBD to Armadale, passing through the heart of the City of Gosnells.

Fuelling our growth is the availability of housing through new land releases and housing developments in Canning Vale and Southern River, while redevelopment is becoming a focus in the suburbs of Maddington, Beckenham, Kenwick and Gosnells.

The City is well served by the major strategic transport links of the Albany, Roe and Tonkin Highways and the Armadale and Thornlie passenger railway lines. These important transport links provide excellent access in and around the Perth metropolitan area and to the south and south-west of the State. Fremantle, WA's largest general cargo port, is just 35 minutes away



by road. The City is also conveniently situated for access to Perth's domestic and international airport – both are within a 15 minute drive.

In addition, the VVA State Government's key planning document *Directions 2031* recognises the secondary centre of Maddington and the district centres of Gosnells, Forest Lakes and Thornlie within the City.


Apart from the City's other economic drivers, its major assets include the Canning River, Thornlie campus of Polytechnic West, Centro Maddington Shopping Centre, Don Russell Performing Arts Centre, Wilkinson Homestead Museum, Gosnells Golf Club, Banyowla Regional Park, Langford Park Sporting Complex, Tom Bateman Sporting Complex, Sutherland Park and the Canning River parklands.

Residents have access to 33 active recreational facilities, 250 passive reserves and 22 conservation reserves. The City manages 765 km of roads and 505 km of footpaths.

Population growth

The population of the City of Gosnells at the 2011 Census was 106,585, which is an increase of 16.4% since the 2006 Census figure of 91,579. That is an increase of 3.1% per annum, a growth rate that has increased from the corresponding rate of 2.1% between the 2001 and 2006 Censuses. This rate of growth is well above the Perth metropolitan area as a whole.

In 2013, the City of Gosnells population is estimated to have reached 115,675. Growth is projected to continue strongly over the period 2011-2031, during which it is estimated more than 35,000 people will be added to the population – an increase of one-third on the 2011 Census population.



Projected resident population for the City of Gosnells, 2006-2031


The projected population increase of 35,000 by 2031 will place great demands on the City's capacity to plan for and house the expected new residents, but plans are in place to deal with the influx.

A mix of new housing developments (especially in Canning Vale, Southern River and Martin) and infill accommodation in the more established parts of the City is planned for the increasing population. Transport hubs and shopping centres, including the Maddington and Gosnells town centres, will be focus points. These developments and other planning initiatives will present opportunities for population and economic growth in the new and in the revitalised activity centres of the City.

Plans for new business and employment are being prepared for the Maddington-Kenwick Strategic Employment Area as well as a business park in Southern River.

It is expected that 3,500 dwellings will be constructed over the next five years, resulting in more than 8,000 residents moving into the City. By 2031, the population of the City is projected to exceed 140,000 people with more than 54,000 dwellings.

The distribution of new residents across the City's suburbs is shown in the following graph:




Projected resident population for suburbs of the City of Gosnells, 2006-2031

This graph shows the following key points:

- Most of the City's population growth will be accommodated in Southern River and Gosnells.
- Canning Vale's current rapid growth will begin to slow in the next five years, as urbanisation in the area reaches completion.
- There are several well-developed suburbs with limited opportunities for further growth, especially Beckenham, Huntingdale, Kenwick, Langford, and Thornlie.

The pattern of well-developed suburbs to our City's west, together with the rapid recent growth in Canning Vale and Southern River, is reflected in the following population density map of the City:




Population density of the City of Gosnells 2011 (persons per hectare)


Population age structure

Generally, the population of the City of Gosnells is younger than that of the Perth metropolitan area.



Resident population age (%), City of Gosnells, 2011

Approximately 25% of the population of the City of Gosnells is aged 17 or younger, compared to 23.2% of the population of the Perth Metropolitan area. In the older age groups, the City of Gosnells has 15.2% of its population aged over 60, and the corresponding figure for the Perth metropolitan area is 17.8%.




Size of the local economy

The total annual output of the City of Gosnells (the total gross revenue in dollars generated by the City's businesses and organisations in one year) was \$6.92 billion at December 2012.

The gross local product generated by businesses and organisations in the City of Gosnells in 2012 was \$3.05 billion.

The graphic below places our local economy in the context of neighbouring local governments, the Cities of Canning and Armadale and in relation to that of the Perth metropolitan area:

Although the economy of the City of Gosnells is approximately twice as large as that of its more rural neighbour, the City of Armadale, it is substantially smaller than that of the more urbanised and more CBD-centric City of Canning.

The City's population at the 2011 Census was 106,585. As gross local product was \$3.05 billion, gross local product per capita was approximately \$28,616.

Measures of the local economy

This section considers the local economy in terms of three measures:


- Output: the gross revenue generated by businesses and organisations in the City of Gosnells.
- Employment: the number of employees in each industry sector.
- Value added: value that is added by industry sectors in the City of Gosnells to intermediate inputs.

The local economy measured by output

The annual output of the City of Gosnells (the total gross revenue in dollars generated by the City's businesses and organisations in one year) was \$6.918 billion at December 2012.

The major industry sectors by output are:

- Manufacturing 26.8%
- Construction 15.9%
- Rental, Hiring and Real Estate Services 13.2%.

Ups and downs – Industry sector output changes since May 2011

The industry sectors that have increased output include:

- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services up 1.1%
- Health Care and Social Assistance up 1%
- Construction up 1.3%.

The industry sectors that have experienced a decrease in output are:

- Manufacturing down 1.8%
- Rental, Hiring and Real Estate Services down 1.6%
- Wholesale down 1%.



The local economy measured by employment

Of the 20,846 jobs in the City of Gosnells, the major industry sectors by employment are:

- Retail Trade 15.1%
- Education and Training 12.9%
- Construction 11%
- Manufacturing 10.7%
- Health Care and Social Assistance 9.5%.

Ups and downs – Industry sector employment changes since May 2011

The industry sectors that have most increased their number of employees are:

- Education and Training increased by 577
- Health Care and Social Assistance increased by 399
- Construction increased by 285
- Public Administration and Safety increased by 278
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services increased by 275.

The industry sectors that have most decreased their number of employees are:

- Wholesale Trade decreased by 51
- Manufacturing decreased by 28
- Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing decreased by 23

Comparison of the employment data with the ranking of the various industry sectors by output (see above) produces some key observations:

- Retail is the City's most important employment sector, reflecting its people-intensive nature (this sector ranks only fourth by output).
- Manufacturing ranks first by output but only fourth by employment, indicating its capitalintensive but relatively non-people-intensive nature.
- Education and Training is the City's second most important employment sector, although it ranks only fourth by output.
- Health and Community Services ranks only ninth by output, but fifth by employment.




The local economy measured by value added

Value added is a measure of productivity of industry sectors and how industries increase the value of their inputs.

Value added is calculated by subtracting local expenditure and regional imports expenditure from the output generated by an industry sector. It is usually regarded as the most accurate economic indicator of an industry sector, because it takes into account that some industries have high levels of output, but also need large amounts of input.

The City's major industry sectors ranked by value added are as follows:

- Rental, Hiring and Real Estate Services 20%
- Manufacturing 13%
- Construction 11.6%.

Ups and downs – Industry sector value added changes since May 2011

The industry sectors that have increased in value added are:

- Construction 1.4%
- Education and Training 1.1%
- Health Care and Social Assistance 1%
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services 1%
- Mining 1%.

The industry sectors that have decreased in value added are:

- Rental, Hiring and Real Estate Services 3.7%
- Manufacturing 1.1%
- Transport, Postal and Warehousing 0.8%
- Wholesale Trade 0.7%.

Employment self-sufficiency and self-containment

Employment self-sufficiency is the ratio of employed local residents to local jobs – that is, local residents have the potential to obtain employment locally.

Employment self-containment is the ratio of local residents working in jobs in the City of Gosnells compared to the total number of all workers living in the City of Gosnells – so it is a measure of people who live here and work here.

Both these employment measures are important in understanding the local economy. Understanding where workers travel from assists in planning and advocacy for roads and public transport provision. It helps to clarify local economic and employment key factors and it helps in understanding the degree to which the local economy relies on the surrounding region to supply its labour force.

The City of Gosnells has an overall employment self-sufficiency of 45.6% (down from 47.3% at the 2006 Census). In its key planning document *Directions* 2031, the State Government set a target of 55% employment self-sufficiency for the south-east Perth metropolitan sub-region, which comprises the local government areas of Gosnells, Armadale and Serpentine-Jarrahdale.

It appears that only significant investment at State and Federal level can bring this target within reach. This investment is required to support current and new small businesses and to assist in developing new industrial areas and employment opportunities.

The table below shows how individual industry sectors rate. Sectors in which the City scores most highly for employment self-sufficiency (all scoring more than 55%) are:

- Administrative and Support Services
- Accommodation and Food Services
- Financial and Insurance Services
- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services.

In terms of employment self-containment, the City's overall rating is 18.6% (down from 19.8% at the 2006 Census), and it rates most highly in the following sectors (all scoring more than 25%).

- Education and Training
- Retail Trade
- Other Services
- Rental, Hiring and Real Estate Services
- Accommodation and Food Services.



Employment self-sufficiency and self-containment, City of Gosnells (2011 Census data)

Where do our workers come from?

The City's overall employment self-sufficiency rate is 45.6% (down from 47.3% at the 2006 Census).

More than one quarter of the local workforce travels from three adjoining local government areas – 12.7% travel from the City of Armadale, 8.5% from the City of Canning and a further 4.6% from the Shire of Kalamunda.




Local Government Areas of residence of workers (%) employed in the City of Gosnells, 2011



Where do our workers travel to?

As we have seen above, 18.6% of local jobs are occupied by local residents. So where do other working residents travel for their work?

The City of Canning is by far the most significant destination for working residents of the City of Gosnells – almost as many residents travel to work in the City of Canning (17.9%) as work locally (18.6%). Other high-ranking destinations include the City of Belmont, inner Perth and the Town of Victoria Park.

The daily migration to work

As discussed above, only 18.6% of employed residents work in the City of Gosnells. Therefore each working day more than 35,000 people leave the City of Gosnells to travel to another LGA to work. As the population of Thornlie is around 24,000, this is equivalent to exporting the population of a very large suburb of workers every working day.

Conversely, of our 20,565 local jobs, approximately half are occupied by people who also live locally. Therefore, in addition to the daily export of 35,000 workers, the City imports more than 10,000 workers each working day. This represents a significant movement of people and consequent pressure on travel time, public and private transport, fuel costs and quality of life. At the 2011 Census, only 8.4% of our workers travelled to work by public transport.

Employment in a regional context

It is instructive to compare the employment picture of the Gosnells LGA with that of its neighbouring LGAs, Canning and Armadale:

More than 30,000 additional local jobs would be required if the City of Gosnells LGA was to offer all its employed residents local employment – a very large increase on the current figure.

The Canning LGA has a jobs surplus (ie; it has more jobs than are required for its employed residents) and it is therefore a significant importer of labour – 18% of its workforce travels from the Gosnells LGA, for example. Even so, only a quarter of all its jobs are occupied by local residents.


The Armadale LGA has a higher level of employment self-containment than the Gosnells LGA – ie; it has the potential to provide jobs for a greater proportion of its residents locally.

The workforce and employment

The labour force of the Gosnells LGA (based on place of employment) was 20,846 at the 2011 Census. As the labour force at the 2006 Census was 18,340, 2,506 local jobs were created from 2006-2011 – an increase of 13.6%. However, during that time the City's population increased by 16.4% and therefore the increase in local jobs did not keep pace with the increase in local population.

Occupations of local residents


The City of Gosnells generally has a smaller proportion of managers and professionals than the Perth metropolitan area but has a larger proportion of technicians, clerical workers, machinery operators and labourers.

Qualifications of local residents

The City of Gosnells has a smaller proportion of its employed people qualified to degree or diploma level than the Perth metropolitan area. More than 21% of its residents have a vocational qualification (more than the figure for the Perth metropolitan area) but nearly 48% have no qualification.



Local unemployment rate

The City of Gosnells unemployment rate was 4.6% at the end of the December 2012 quarter, an improvement from 5.3% a year earlier. However, the local unemployment rate has consistently remained between 0.5% and 1% higher than the rate for the Perth metropolitan area.

The City of Gosnells unemployment rate was approximately 1.5% below that of the City of Armadale and approximately 0.3% below that of the City of Belmont. However, other nearby LGAs, such as the Cities of Canning and Cockburn and the Town of Victoria Park, have consistently lower unemployment rates.

Employment growth sectors – recent changes

Which of our local industry sectors are providing more local employment and which are shedding jobs? The table below examines the changes in job numbers between the 2006 and 2011 Census.

There was employment growth in the following sectors:

- Professional, Scientific and Technical Services
- Health Care and Social Assistance
- Mining

- Construction
- Education and Training
- Transport, Postal and Warehousing.


Conversely, there were job losses in the Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing and Information Media and Telecommunications sectors.

Overall, 7,128 jobs were added – but this must be placed in the context of a population increase of more than 15,000 people.

Registered Australian Business Names (ABNs) in the City of Gosnells

There were 23,186 registered ABNs with a business address in the City of Gosnells at the end of 2012.

Note that analysis of ABN registrations does not include businesses that operate in the City of Gosnells, but which have their ABN registered elsewhere. This excludes, for example, many large retail businesses and many franchised businesses.

The largest sectors by number of registered businesses at the end of 2012 were:

- Construction 23.5%
- Transport, Postal and Warehousing 10.5%
- Professional, Scientific and Technical 9.1%
- Financial and Insurance 8.8%
- Other Services 8.4%.

ABN hotspot sectors for the City of Gosnells

The City of Gosnells had 1,528 newly-registered ABNs in the 2012 calendar year. That is an average of 127 new registrations a month.


Given the prominence of the Construction sector in the City's economy (as indicated in the preceding figures) it is not surprising to see numerous Construction-related types of employment in the table above.

Also, most of the sectors listed in the table above are those dominated by sole traders and small businesses.

Business attraction – the current picture

What are the trends in the new businesses that the City is attracting?

In 2012, 1,527 new businesses were registered in the City and their distribution across our suburbs was as follows:




New business registrations, by the City of Gosnells suburb, 2012



As might be expected, the larger suburbs attracted most of the new businesses, especially Canning Vale, with its large industrial zones.

The distribution of these new businesses by industry sector was as follows:




New business registrations by industry sector, City of Gosnells, 2012

Most of the new businesses are being attracted to the following industry sectors:

- Construction
- Administrative and Support Services
- Professional, Scientific and Technical
- Transport, Postal and Warehousing.

Business entity types

The importance of sole traders and small family businesses to the City of Gosnells economy is illustrated by the following figure:

High proportions of businesses in the sole trader and small family business categories are generally an indicator of a vibrant local business sector. In the City of Gosnells, nearly 60% of all locally registered businesses are sole traders.



Thornlie, Canning Vale, Gosnells and Maddington contain more than two-thirds of all the City's businesses.

Personal income

The per capita wage and salary income for people in the City of Gosnells was \$46,403 for the 2009-10 financial year. This is considerably less than that of WA as a whole (\$53,397) and of many nearby LGAs.

However, the low local income must be balanced against a lower local cost of living, especially in relation to real estate prices. In addition, the City of Gosnells' generally younger population profile means it has more people yet to enter the peak income earning stages of their lives.




Figure 1: City of Gosnells registered ABNs by major industry sector, 2012




Figure 2: Agriculture; Mining; Manufacturing registered ABNs, City of Gosnells, 2012




Figure 3: Electricity, Gas and Water; Construction; Wholesale; Retail; Accommodation and Food registered ABNs, City of Gosnells, 2012




Figure 4: Transport; Information; Financial; Rental and Real Estate; Professional and Scientific registered ABNs, City of Gosnells, 2012

Note that three categories are off scale: Road Transport n=1072, Property Operators and Real Estate Services n=846 and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services n=1351




Figure 5: Administrative and Support; Public Administration; Education; Health; Arts and Recreation registered ABNs, City of Gosnells, 2012




